Dear Potential SJC Service Trip Team Member,

We are happy to announce our upcoming service trip opportunities with Partners in Development (PID) at their work site in Guatemala. This year, we are offering the following trip options:

Site	Approx. Dates	Est. # of Slots	Credits	Estimated Costs
1. Guatemala (Public Health Course)	December 16-22	10 (all filled)	4	\$800 – room, board, ground transp. \$400 – program, admin fee
2. Guatemala – Team 1 (Medical Focus)	January 2-8	10	2	<u>\$1,200 (est.) – airfare</u> \$2,400 (est.) – Total*
3. Guatemala – Team 2 (Special Projects Focus)	January 9-15	10	2	*This represents our current “best guess,” actual cost may be slightly lower or higher.

If you would like to be considered for one of our teams, please complete the SJC [International Service Trip Registration Form](#). **Your registration will not be considered complete until your first deposit is received.** The first deposit of \$1500 represents the approximate airfare and admin fee. Checks should be made payable to Saint Joseph’s College and delivered to Dr. Steven Bridge’s faculty mailbox (on the 4<sup>th</sup> floor of Alfond Hall) or office (#404 in Alfond Hall).

All registrations and initial deposits must be made by **no later than 4pm on Tuesday, October 11th**. The second deposit of approximately \$900 represents room, board, and ground transportation. Payment for the remaining balance of the trip must be completed by **Tuesday, November 8**.

Following October 11, we will be reviewing all applications to finalize our teams. Team selection will ultimately be decided based on a variety of factors, including, but not limited to: order received, prior experience, class standing, etc. (Of course, any applicants not selected to go on their desired trip will have the option to either switch their trips or to receive their deposits back.)

We hope to have our teams finalized by October 15. After that time, we’ll sponsor a series of informational sessions (covering topics such as the history, politics, and economics of these locations, cultural norms, basic foreign language skills, etc.) designed to better prepare our participants and to build camaraderie among our group. Academic credit (2 hours) for these trips is available for those full-time undergraduate students who: A) attend the preparatory sessions, B) successfully participate on the work-team, and C) write up a timely and detailed reflection of their experience following the trip.

Finally, keep in mind that certain aspects of this trip will require some advanced planning on your part. In particular, team members are strongly encouraged to obtain or update their passports as soon as possible. PID requires all team members to be fully vaccinated and to submit a negative COVID test within 72 hours of departure. Furthermore, they are advised to have their Tetanus immunizations current, and to receive the Hep-A vaccine as well.
